THINGS TO SEE IN SIAM

The Royal *Grand Palace* & *Emerald Buddha* *Temple*

This is a ‘must see’ attraction for all visitors to Bangkok. This royal compound embraces a remarkable collection of structures including Wat Phra Kaeo, the temple that houses the famous Emerald Buddha. Built in 1782, the Grand Palace was a royal residence for many generations and is still used for ceremonies and for accommodating Heads of State.

Dress code: Visitors must be properly dressed when entering the grounds of the Grand Palace. Men are required to wear shirts with sleeves and long trousers. Ladies must likewise cover their shoulders and wear full length skirts or dresses. Clothing for men and women may be hired for a nominal fee from the office at the main entrance to the compound.

Wat Pho

Temple of Reclining Buddha

Wat Pho, situated close to the Grand Palace, is home to the Reclining Buddha. The temple, built during the reign of King Rama I, is considered to be a place of healing and was famous many centuries ago for its pharmacy and as Thailand's first university – both established by King Rama III. Traditional Thai and foot massages are available at the traditional medical school. Expect to pay a premium compared to massage shops elsewhere in the city. The Reclining Buddha measures 45 metres long by 15 metres high. The soles of the feet, inlaid with precious stones, denote the 108 signs of true faith. The statue's long earlobes signify noble birth and the lotus-bud configuration of the hand symbolises purity and beauty.

Wat Arun Temple of Dawn

Wat Arun dates back to ancient battles between the former Siam and neighbouring Burma. Having fallen to the Burmese, Ayutthaya was reduced to rubble and ashes, but General Taksin and the remaining survivors vowed to march 'until the sun rose again' and to build a temple at that precise location. Wat Arun, the Temple of the Dawn, is that temple and was later the site of a royal palace and a private chapel. This temple steps provide stunning views as the sun sinks over the Chao Praya River. Access is easy by boat to the temple's jetty.

Jim Thompson's House

Museum

Jim Thompson's three decades of dedication to the revival of Thai silk, then a dying art, changed the industry forever. After he disappeared in Malaysia's Cameron Highlands in 1967 but his legacy remains with the Jim Thomson brand synonymous with high quality Thai fabrics. The Jim Thompson House and Museum is a charming complex of six teak houses that contain priceless antiques and works of art. Tours are available in several languages.

Erawan Shrine

The Erawan Shrine is one of the most popular places of prayer in Bangkok. This Brahman shrine sits proudly at Ratchaprasong, close to the BTS Sky Train network (Chidlom station) and many shopping malls. It's a fascinating experience with the clouds of incense, garlands of flowers and Thai performers displaying traditional dance moves. It was erected to appease works after many problems arose during the constriction of a nearby hotel.

Vegetarian Festival 2025

21 - 29 October 2025

Vegetarian Festival 2025, formally known as Nine Emperor Gods Festival (เทศกาลกินเจ / 九皇勝會), will be held from 21–29 October 2025, beginning on the eve of 20 October and continuing to 29 October 2025, according to the ninth month of the Chinese lunar calendar. Widely celebrated across Thailand, devotees observe a vegetarian diet during this period as a form of body purification. The Taoist festival was introduced to Thailand centuries ago and has since become a major cultural event.

Bangkok Vegetarian Festival 2025

The festival is celebrated mostly in Bangkok's Chinatown, Yaowarat. Preparations start as early as one week before the event, when yellow banners and flags are placed prominently in the area.

Shopping malls in Bangkok will hold food fairs throughout the festival, offering vegetarian and vegan dishes from around the world.

End of Buddhist Lent (Ok Phansa Day)

7 October 2025

Ok Phansa Day marks the end of the three-month Buddhist Lent period and the traditional end of the rainy season. The final day of the Buddhist Lent period falls on the full-moon day of the eleventh lunar moon and is known in most parts of Thailand as Awk Phansa, although there are some regional variations. According to Buddhist belief, the day commemorates Buddha's descent back to earth after spending three months in heaven visiting his mother. His return was greeted by his followers with gifts of food, and today Thai Buddhists mark the event by visiting the wat and making merit. Different regions have their own way of marking the occasion, but it's common at this time of year to see organised long-boat races.

Robes Offering (Thod Kathin)

For a one-month period following the end of the Rains Retreat, new robes and offerings are made to the monkhood as part of a ceremony known as 'thod kathin.' Throughout Thailand, various thod kathin events and festivities are arranged, whilst in Bangkok, there is a royal ceremony usually held at Wat Arun (Temple of the Dawn).

Ok Phansa is one of the days in the year when there are restrictions in place on alcohol sales.

Loy Krathong Festival of Light

6 November 2025

Celebrated nationwide, Loy Krathong is probably Thailand's most beautiful and enchanting festival. The word loy (or loi) means to float, whilst krathong are small rafts or baskets. Traditionally made from banana leaves or the bark of a banana tree, the krathongs usually contain a candle, incense and flowers. The person floating the krathong often takes a small clipping of their hair or fingernail, which is added to the krathong together with some coins. The candle and incense are then lit and a wish is made before the krathong is placed on the nearest stretch of water. It is believed that the krathong carries away bad luck and signals a fresh start.

The festival has evolved to include music concerts and beauty pageants and is another great excuse for a party. Falling during the school holidays, Loy Krathong is also a family affair, with parents often helping their children to make the krathongs.

King Bhumibol Birthday Commemoration Day

5 December 2025

Remembering the Father of the Nation

The fifth of December is a public holiday in Thailand in honour of the late king, His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej. The Thai monarch was born on 5 December, and this date is also celebrated as Father's Day in recognition of a man who was fondly regarded as the 'Father of The Nation'. The formal name of the holiday translates into English as King Bhumibol Adulyadej's Birthday Anniversary. Depending on where you are in Thailand, there may be restrictions on alcohol sales on 5 December.

During his lifetime, the king's birthday on 5 December was a national day of celebration. Provinces throughout Thailand staged special events featuring fireworks, candle-lit ceremonies and music concerts. While commemorative events are likely to be more subdued in the years following the passing of the king, 5 December will remain a day to celebrate the king's life and achievements. In Bangkok, it has been a tradition for Ratchadamnoen Avenue and the area around the Grand Palace to be beautifully illuminated with strings of lights in December, and it is expected that this tradition will continue.

New Year's Eve

31 December 2025

Thailand doesn't just celebrate New Year once; it does so on three separate occasions. Like the rest of the world, 31 December sees parties and fireworks at locations across Thailand as the clock strikes midnight and the New Year is ushered in. However, the New Year festivities don't end there. The Chinese New Year, which usually falls in January or February, is also celebrated by many Thais. Then, in April, there is the most eagerly anticipated holiday of the year: Songkran, the traditional Thai New Year.

Sawasdee Pii Mai: Happy New Year

If you're in Thailand at the end of December, you will hear people wishing each other 'Sawasdee Pii Mai'.

New Year Countdown

Countdown events are hosted at venues across Thailand on New Year's Eve, with the largest, though not necessarily the best, centred on the area outside CentralWorld in Bangkok. The period of 31 December and 1 January is a public holiday in Thailand and coincides with the peak of the high season. This results in increased demand for transport and accommodation, so it is advisable to book in advance. Popular tourist attractions across the country are likely to be busier than usual, with a surge of both domestic tourists and international visitors.

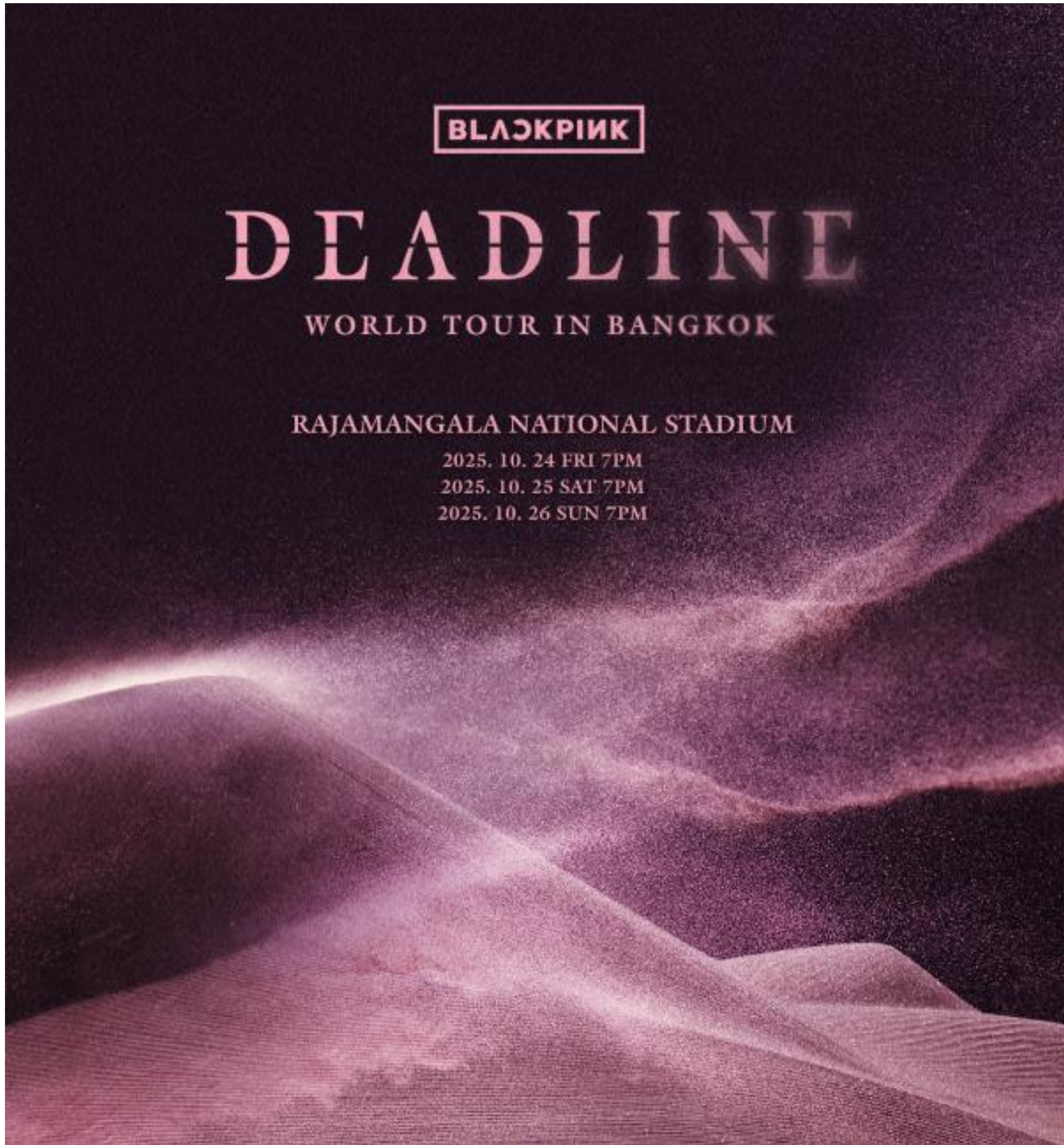

ONE Fight Night 36: Prajanchai vs. Di Bella II

Memories will be made and dreams achieved when ONE Fight Night 36: Prajanchai vs. Di Bella II airs live in U.S. primetime from Bangkok's iconic Lumpinee Stadium on Friday, 3 October.

In the main event, the best strawweight striker from the East meets the greatest strawweight striker from the West in a high-stakes rematch for the undisputed ONE Strawweight Kickboxing World Title.

When ONE Strawweight Muay Thai World Champion Prajanchai PK Saenchai and former kickboxing titleholder Jonathan Di Bella first met in June 2024, the duo went to war over five gruelling rounds for the division's vacant kickboxing belt.

Though it was a razor-close battle, Thailand's Prajanchai emerged with a unanimous decision victory, leaving the ring with the gold and handing his Italian-Canadian rival the only loss of his career.

Since that fateful night in Bangkok, a lot has changed. Prajanchai successfully defended his Muay Thai crown, while Di Bella worked his way back up the ladder and claimed the ONE Interim Strawweight Kickboxing World Championship.

ONE Fight Night 37: Kryklia vs. Agdeve

A historic event awaits Thai fans, as ONE Championship returns to Lumpinee Stadium in Bangkok for ONE Fight Night 37: Kryklia vs. Agdeve.

In the main event, two of the biggest and most dominant strikers on the planet collide for the inaugural ONE Heavyweight Kickboxing World Title.

Towering Ukrainian superstar Roman Kryklia has dominated the competition, having defeated his adversaries en route to the organisation's light heavyweight kickboxing gold and heavyweight Muay Thai crown.

The 6-foot-7 fighter has his eyes on capturing a historic third belt, but undefeated 21-year-old phenom Samet Agdeve is determined to stop him. Known as 'The King', Agdeve has knocked out almost every single opponent he has faced and now aims to add Kryklia's name to that list to claim ONE World Title gold.

ONE Fight Night 37 also features two of Thailand's most beloved Muay Thai heroes, Rambolek Chor Ajalaboon and Nakrob Fairtex. Rambolek, the #4-ranked bantamweight contender, will face surging Russian knockout artist Abdulla Dayakaev, while Nakrob will step up against former ONE Flyweight Muay Thai World Title challenger Jacob Smith.

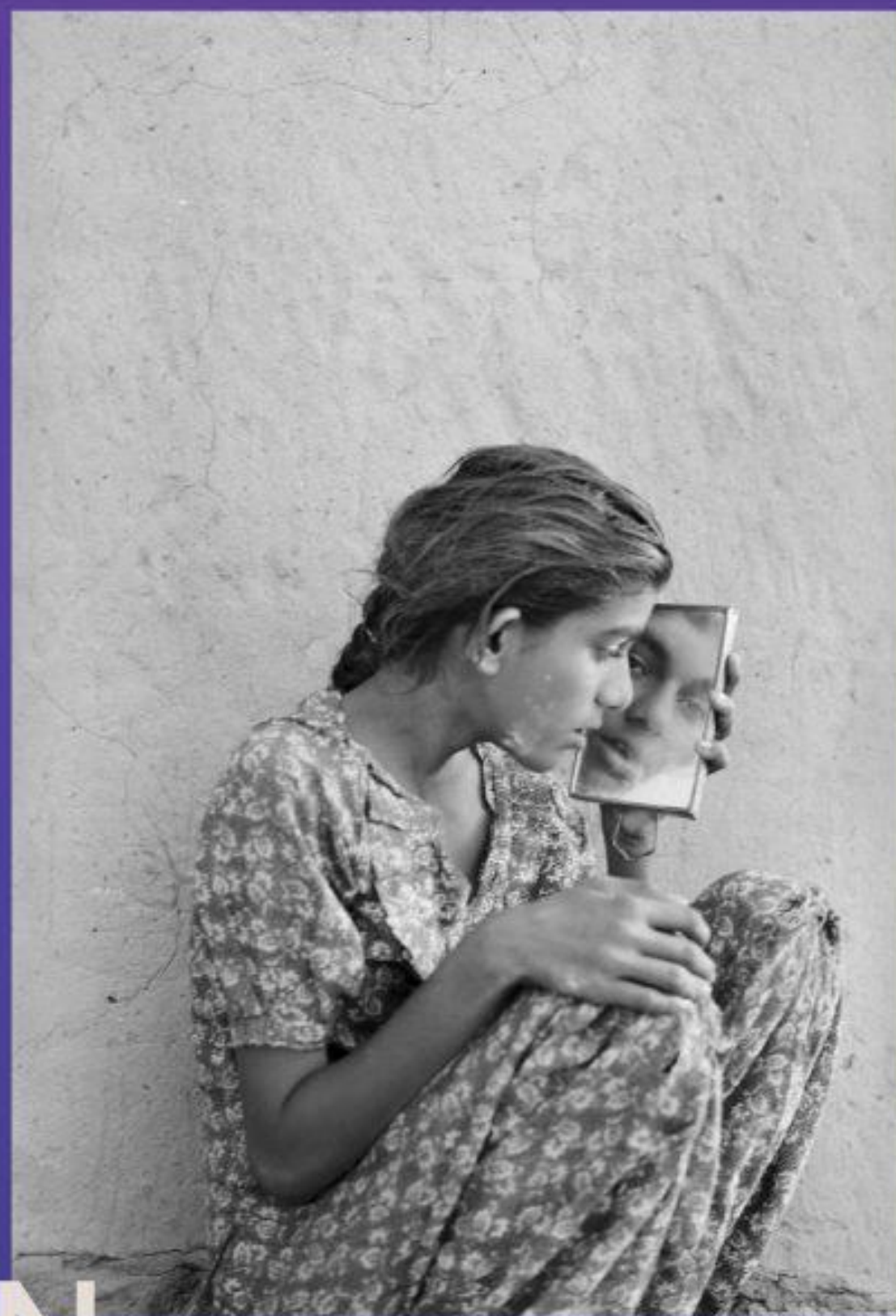

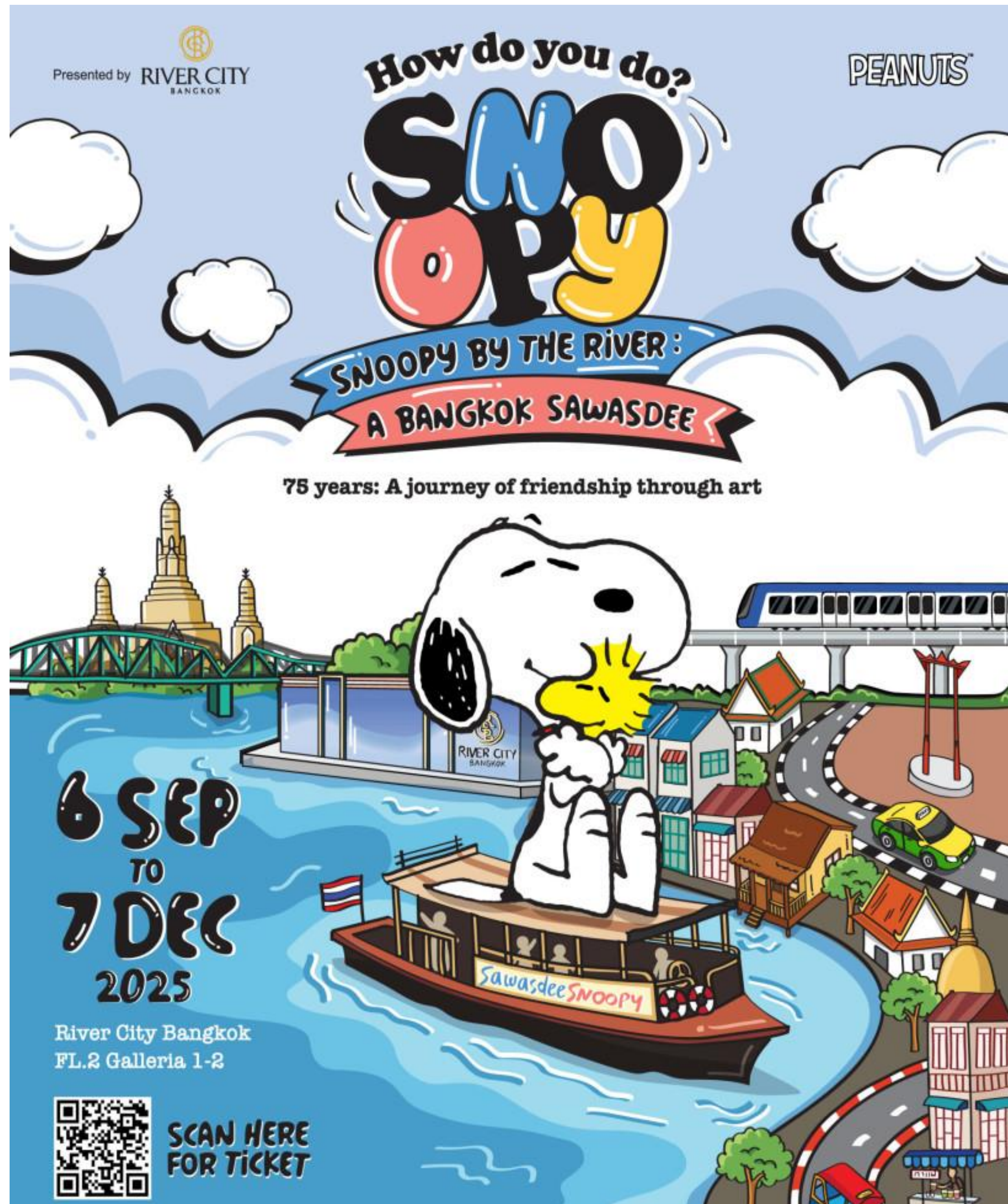
